Subject: RE: Publication Offices OP Who's Who: data protection.

Dear Hilde,

I am coming back to the issue of the publication of the names and contact details of all Commission staff in the OP Who's who. After further internal consultations and having checked with the two other main EU institutions what their practice is, we have decided to align ours with the one of the European Parliament and the Council, namely to limit the publication of the names and contact details of all staff occupying management/organigramme positions, e.g. heads of units and above. The reasons for this change of approach are linked to data protection and to security considerations, following a number of recent events. I have informed the President's cabinet accordingly.

Could you please therefore ask your colleagues in charge of the Who's who to implement the new approach as soon as possible?

I am putting colleagues from DG HR in copy of this message so that they can assist you in the identification of all staff concerned in their databases.
